Re: Specifications for Phase I/II HVDC-TF Service

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National Grid is providing this notice concerning National Grid's participation in the extended Phase I/II Support Agreements and Restated Use Agreement (the "Agreements") for an additional twenty (20) year term beyond October 31, 2020, and certain amendments to those Agreements.

On December 18, 2020, New England Hydro-Transmission Electric Company, Inc.; New England Hydro-Transmission Corporation; New England Electric Transmission Corporation; and Vermont Electric Transmission Company (collectively "the Asset Owners") and the IRH Management Committee ("IMC") on behalf of the renewing Interconnection Rights Holders ("IRH") submitted for approval an Offer of Settlement that amends and restates the Agreements. National Grid has identified no revised terms and conditions in the Agreements applicable to providing firm or non-firm, point-to-point transmission service over the Phase I/II HVDC-TF Intertie, that would prohibit National Grid from providing such transmission service to its Transmission Customers.

As a result of the amended and restated Agreements and Offer of Settlement as filed, and subject to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") acceptance, existing Phase I/II HVDC-TF Service Agreements in effect with National Grid will not require any revisions. Furthermore, there is nothing in the amended and restated Agreements as filed that will alter service to Transmission Customers under existing Phase I/II HVDC-TF Service Agreements. Until FERC permits amendments to the Agreements to go into effect, the existing terms and conditions of the Agreements will remain in effect. As a Schedule 20A Service Provider, National Grid will continue to provide firm and non-firm, point-to-point transmission service under existing Phase I/II HVDC-TF Service Agreements.
