The label enables consumers to look at the energy sources and air emissions of the power used to serve their needs. Consumers can compare energy labels to make the best choice based on their energy needs.

### Air Emissions

Air emissions from the electric power resources used to serve National Grid's Last Resort Service customers in Rhode Island are compared to the New England regional average air emissions for all power resources in the period 04/01/08 - 03/31/09.
