Simple tactics to keep cool, reduce costs.

A well-maintained, energy-efficient home can lower your energy bill while enhancing your comfort. As the outdoor temperature rises there are a few easy tips you can use to improve your home's efficiency.

- Install programmable thermostats to adjust temperatures when rooms are unoccupied, saving you up to \$180 per year.
- Upgrade air conditioning equipment to more energy-efficient models reducing maintenance and lowering energy costs as much as 30 percent overall.
- Change filters on air conditioners to improve air quality.
- Keep doors and windows closed while running your air conditioner.
- Lower blinds and shades during the day to keep your home cool when the sun is out.
- Make sure vents are clear so air is distributed evenly.

No identification? Don't let them in.

National Grid employees, including contractors, are required to carry a photo identification card with company logo. If someone is requesting entry into your home or business without the proper ID, do not let them in and contact customer service at 1-800-322-3223. Handy tip for CO safety.

Carbon monoxide is an invisible, odorless gas that can be deadly if left undetected. It's good to be CO aware year-round even as summer approaches.

If you use a back-up generator to supply power during an outage, be sure to operate it outdoors. Open windows do not provide sufficient ventilation to safely operate a generator indoors. Also, never use a gas range for heating, or to burn coal or charcoal, in an enclosed space.







Restrain pets for safety.

In an attempt to keep your furry friends and our workforce safe, we ask that you properly restrain your pets prior to our arrival. Failure to do so could delay our ability to complete the service order in a timely manner.

Keep that oven door closed.
