

PL-E12 Natural Gas Infrastructure Reinforcement Project

Project Update | December 2024

National Grid's commitment to our customers and communities begins by providing safe, reliable service, and meeting the increasing demand for energy. To that end, National Grid will be making improvements to our infrastructure so it can continue to safely supply the customers in the Glens Falls area with natural gas.

Project Description

We are about to begin a natural gas infrastructure improvement project in your area which will continue the reliable delivery of natural gas to our customers. The project will replace the pipeline that runs between South Glens Falls and Glens Falls.

What activities will occur?

National Grid and our approved contractors have been and will be in your area, performing preliminary engineering and environmental due diligence activities on National Grid property near your neighborhood. This will be followed by forestry work.

How will forestry work affect me?

Extensive tree removal work will be done along the South Glens Falls side, near the Betar Byway. A segment of the vegetated area is infested with invasive species, including the Porcelain Berry plant, which has identified by the Nature Conservancy as a threat to spread into the Adirondack Park. National Grid will employ proper removal and disposal techniques to remove this plant and contain its spread along the bikeway.

What will construction impacts be?

The construction impacts will vary based on location and project phase. Our team will work with community members to notify them of upcoming activities. Please contact us if you would like to discuss timelines related to your location.
