Act fast in a gas emergency.

If you smell gas anywhere, including your home, go outside immediately and call **911** or **1-718-643-4050**. The following conditions should be reported:

- Smelling gas
- Abnormal pressure or no gas in appliances
- Gas flow to appliances that cannot be shut off
- Continuous flow of water leaking from gas heating unit or water heater
- Roaring, hissing or whistling noise from gas pipes
- Seeing white cloud, mist, fog or bubbles in standing water outside
- Odor that irritates eyes, nose and/or throat



Lower the water heater temperature for safety.

Did you know that water heaters are the second highest source of energy use in the home? The good news is that you can save energy – and reduce your bill – by lowering the water temperature on your heater to 120 degrees. Also, it's important to note the average water heater only lasts 10 to 15 years. Consider upgrading before it's too late. Look to **nationalgridus.com** for available rebates, offers, and services to help you save energy. When choosing a new appliance always select ENERGY STAR®-qualified appliances.

Adjust settings with Wi-Fi thermostat.

The weather can change and, with a Wi-Fi enabled thermostat, you can change your home's temperature simply by using your smartphone, tablet or laptop. Ideal for both homes and apartments, Wi-Fi thermostats allow you to adjust temperature settings when you're away from home or asleep. Using the device can lower your energy bill up to \$180 per year. Choose your gas supplier with NaturalChoiceSM.


Residential and business customers have the power to choose their natural gas supplier through the NaturalChoiceSM Program. By enrolling in NaturalChoiceSM you may be able to benefit from competition among gas suppliers (or energy service companies). No matter who supplies your gas National Grid will handle the transfer, maintain the local gas distribution network, and be available 24 hours a day to respond to gas safety emergencies. Payment assistance available.

Income-eligible customers of National Grid may qualify for a reduction in the “gas delivery cost” on the bill. You may qualify if you receive one or more of the following:

- Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)
- Medicaid
- Food Stamps
- Public Assistance (Family Assistance or Safety Net Assistance)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Veteran’s Disability Pension
- Veteran’s Surviving Spouse Pension
- Child Health Plus

April 28 marks the annual observance of trees – Arbor Day. Do your part by planting a tree to add value to your home and, at the same time, reduce your energy bill. To provide shade in the summer, but maintain the sun’s warmth in winter, plant deciduous trees that shed leaves in the fall on the east and south sides of your home.
