Focusing on water usage helps conserve water and can lower your energy bill significantly. A high-efficiency natural gas water heater can save up to 30 percent on your energy bill and the savings will increase by up to \$450 thanks to available energy rebates. Visit **ngrid.com/save** to view a list of qualifying equipment and available rebate forms.

You can also:

- Stop leaks to save gallons of water and reduce your bill.
- Install water-saving faucets and low-flow showerheads.
- Set water heater temperature at 120° F to prevent scalding.
- Upgrade your water heater to a high-efficiency model.
 Water heaters with an Energy Factor of .67 or greater (.82 or greater for larger systems) are ideal.
