As required by the Department of Health in each of the states we operate in, we have implemented a daily screening process to determine whether or not an employee, contractor, or vendor, is permitted into an office or on a work-site. Additionally, we are requiring all contractors and vendors to complete a Daily Symptom Check on their employees before they enter a National Grid work location.

Additionally, we refer you to National Grid's Standard Terms and Conditions, which require contractors to comply with all government and company safety requirements, which may change with greater frequency in these times.

Please refer to the <u>COVID-19 Daily Symptom Check</u> – <u>Visitors</u> form we use at National Grid. You are welcome to utilize this same form or develop one of your own. If you answer "Yes" to any of the questions, please leave the

work location, contact your employer and notify National Grid's Employee Services at (888) 483-2123 (to trigger contact tracing for National Grid employees you were in contact with). If you feel that you have symptoms related to COVID-19 please contact your healthcare provider.

As a reminder, we ask that all visitors wear a face covering and adhere to social distancing protocols while on National Grid property. Finally, all National Grid contractors and vendors must follow state travel quarantine mandates.
