NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 16-137

September 7, 2016

Petition of Boston Gas Company and Colonial Gas Company, each d/b/a National Grid, for approval of their Revenue Decoupling Adjustment Factors for the 2016-2017 Peak Period, November 1, 2016 through April 30, 2017.

On August 3, 2016, Boston Gas Company ("Boston Gas") and Colonial Gas Company ("Colonial Gas"), each d/b/a National Grid (collectively "National Grid" or "Company") filed a petition with the Department of Public Utilities ("Department") for approval of their revenue decoupling adjustment factors ("RDAFs"), for effect November 1, 2016. This filing was made pursuant to <u>Boston Gas Company/Essex Gas Company/ Colonial Gas Company</u>, D.P.U. 10-55, at 52-54 (2010) and the Company's revenue decoupling adjustment clause ("RDAC") tariff, M.D.P.U. No. 5.3. The RDAC allows the Company to modify, on a semi-annual basis, its base distribution rates as a result of changes in customer usage, in order to promote the efficient deployment of demand resources. D.P.U. 10-55, at 52-54. The Department has docketed this petition as D.P.U. 16-137.

The Company proposes the following RDAFs for Boston Gas Company, effective November 1, 2016:

For Colonial Gas Company, the Company proposes the following RDAFs, effective November 1, 2016:

As a result of the changes to the RDAF, the average Boston Gas residential heating customer using 134 therms per month during the peak period will experience a bill increase of \$9.44 or 5.55 percent. The average Colonial Gas residential heating customer using 108 therms per month will experience a bill increase of \$7.37 or 5.75 percent. The Company states that the impact for other Boston Gas and Colonial Gas customers on basic service, at each class's average usage, will be less than 6.70 percent. For specific bill impacts, please contact the Company as shown below.
