## NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 17-129

August 28, 2017

Petition of Boston Gas Company and Colonial Gas Company d/b/a National Grid for approval of the Companies' Revenue Decoupling Adjustment Factors for the 2017-2018 Peak Period, November 1, 2017 through April 30, 2018.

On August 3, 2017, Boston Gas Company ("Boston Gas") and Colonial Gas Company ("Colonial Gas"), each d/b/a National Grid (collectively "National Grid" or "Company") filed a petition with the Department of Public Utilities ("Department") for approval of their revenue decoupling adjustment factors ("RDAFs"), for effect November 1, 2017. This filing was made pursuant to <u>Boston Gas Company/Essex Gas Company/ Colonial Gas Company</u>, D.P.U. 10-55, at 52-54 (2010) and the Company's revenue decoupling adjustment clause ("RDAC") tariff, M.D.P.U. No. 5.3. The RDAC allows the Company to modify, on a semi-annual basis, its base distribution rates as a result of changes in customer usage, in order to promote the efficient deployment of demand resources. D.P.U. 10-55, at 52-54. The Department has docketed this petition as D.P.U. 17-129.

The Company proposes the following RDAF credits for Boston Gas Company, effective November 1, 2017:

For Colonial Gas Company, the Company proposes the following RDAF credits, effective November 1, 2017:

As a result of the changes to the RDAF, the average Boston Gas residential heating customer using 133 therms per month during the peak period will experience a bill decrease of \$1.09 or 0.59 percent from the previously effective peak RDAF rate. The average Colonial Gas residential heating customer using 108 therms per month will experience a bill decrease of \$0.78 or 0.55 percent from the previously effective peak RDAF rate. The Company states that the average monthly bill impact for all Boston Gas and Colonial Gas rate classes at each class's average usage will be decreases of less than 0.80 percent as compared to last year's peak period RDAF.
