### NOTICE OF FILING, PUBLIC HEARING, AND PROCEDURAL CONFERENCE

D.P.U. 18-104

November 2, 2018

Petition of Boston Gas Company d/b/a National Grid for approval of three-year gas supply option contract with ENGIE Gas & LNG, LLC, pursuant to G.L. c. 164, § 94A.

On October 9, 2018, Boston Gas Company d/b/a National Grid (“National Grid” or “Company”) filed a petition with the Department of Public Utilities (“Department”) seeking approval of a three-year gas supply option contract (“Agreement”) with ENGIE Gas & LNG, LLC (“ENGIE”) pursuant to G.L. c. 164, § 94A. The Agreement provides that the Company has the option to have ENGIE deliver up to an agreed maximum daily quantity at the existing point of interconnection between ENGIE’s facilities and the Company’s distribution system located in Everett, Massachusetts. The Department has docketed this petition as D.P.U. 18-104.

The Department will conduct a public hearing to receive comments on the Company’s petition on **Tuesday, November 27, 2018 at 2:00 p.m.** at the Department’s offices, One South Station, 5<sup>th</sup> Floor, Boston, Massachusetts 02110. The Department will conduct a procedural conference immediately following the public hearing.

Any person who desires to file written comments or to participate otherwise in this proceeding shall file an original and one copy of such written comments or petition for leave to intervene in the proceeding with Mark D. Marini, Secretary, Department of Public Utilities, One South Station, Boston, Massachusetts, 02110, no later than 5:00 p.m. on **Monday, November 26, 2018**, and serve one copy on counsel for the Company, Stacey Donnelly, Esq., National Grid, 40 Sylvan Road, Waltham, MA 02451 and John Habib, Esq., Keegan Werlin LLP, 99 High Street, 29<sup>th</sup> Floor, Boston, MA 02110.

A petition for leave to intervene must satisfy the timing and substantive requirements of 220 CMR 1.03. Receipt by the Department, not mailing, constitutes filing and determines whether a petition has been timely filed. A petition filed late may be disallowed as untimely, unless good cause is shown for waiver under 220 CMR 1.01(4). To be allowed, a petition under 220 CMR 1.03(1) must satisfy the standing requirements of G.L. c. 30A, § 10.

The electronic filing should also include the name, title, and telephone number of a person to contact in the event of questions about the filing. All documents submitted in electronic format will be posted on the Department's website.
