NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 19-04

January 25, 2019

Petition of Massachusetts Electric Company and Nantucket Electric Company each d/b/a National Grid for approval of their annual Revenue Decoupling Adjustment Factors for effect March 1, 2019.

On January 15, 2019, Massachusetts Electric Company and Nantucket Electric Company, each d/b/a National Grid (“National Grid” or “Company”) filed a petition with the Department of Public Utilities (“Department”) for approval of their annual Revenue Decoupling Adjustment Factors (“RDAFs”) for effect March 1, 2019. This filing was made pursuant to the Company’s Revenue Decoupling Mechanism (“RDM”) tariff, M.D.P.U. No. 1367. The RDM allows the Company to adjust, on an annual basis, its base distribution rates as a result of changes in customer usage, in order to promote the efficient deployment of demand resources. Massachusetts Electric Company and Nantucket Electric Company, D.P.U. 15-155, at 30 (2016). The Department has docketed this matter as D.P.U. 19-04.

The Company proposes the following RDAF charges, effective March 1, 2019:

Rate Classes	RDAFs (\$/kilowatt-hour (“kWh”))
Residential, R-1, R-2	\$0.00250
Residential Time of Use, R-4	\$0.00336
Small Commercial & Industrial, G-1	\$0.00195
General Service Demand, G-2	\$0.00146
Time of Use, G-3	\$0.00091
Streetlighting, S	\$0.00204

As a result of the changes to the RDAF, the average National Grid residential customer using 600 kWh per month will experience a bill increase of \$0.17, or 0.1 percent. The Company states that, depending on class and usage, the impact on the total bill will range from an increase of 0.1 percent to 0.7 percent for all customers. For specific bill impacts, please contact the Company as shown below.
