NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 23-OGAF-GRID

March 24, 2023

Petition of Boston Gas Company d/b/a National Grid pursuant to G.L. c. 164 and 220 CMR 6.00 for approval of its 2023 off-peak gas adjustment factor filing, effective May 1, 2023.

On March 17, 2023, Boston Gas Company d/b/a National Grid (“Company” or “National Grid”) filed with the Department of Public Utilities (“Department”) its off-peak gas adjustment factor (“GAF”), pursuant to G.L. c. 164 and 220 CMR 6.00. The filing includes the Company’s off-peak GAFs for effect May 1, 2023 through October 31, 2023, as well as the reconciliation of its 2022 off-peak period gas costs. The Department has docketed this petition as D.P.U. 23-OGAF-GRID.

The table below summarizes the proposed rates in dollars per therm:

All Customers (excluding G-44B & G-54B)	\$0.4217
G-44B and G-54B	\$0.2905
G-44B and G-54B	\$1.2451/MDCQ therms

If the Department approves the Company’s GAFs as proposed, a typical Boston Gas residential heating (R-3) customer will see an average monthly bill decrease of \$12.21 per month, or 21.9 percent, compared to the 2022 off peak period. A typical former Colonial Gas residential heating (R-3) customer will see an average monthly bill decrease of \$12.21 per month, or 23.5 percent, compared to the 2022 off peak period. For specific bill impacts, please contact the Company as shown below.

National Grid may, at any time during the off-peak period, submit an amended GAF filing. The amended GAF filing must be submitted seven business days before the first billing cycle of the month in which it is proposed to take effect.

Any person interested in commenting on the filing may submit written comments no later than the close of business on Friday, April 7, 2023. At this time, all filings will be submitted only in electronic format consistent with the Commission’s June 15, 2021 directive related to modified filing requirements. Ordinarily, all parties would follow Sections B.1 and B.4 of the

Department's Standard Ground Rules (D.P.U. 15-184-A, App. 1 (March 4, 2020)); however, until further notice, parties must retain the original paper version and the Department will later determine when the paper version must be filed with the Department Secretary. Importantly, all large files submitted must be broken down into electronic files that do not exceed 20 MB. In addition, one copy of all written comments should be emailed to the Company's attorney, Christopher R. Tuomala, Esq. at Christopher.Tuomala@nationalgrid.com.

All documents should also be submitted to the Department in PDF format by e-mail attachment to dpu.efiling@mass.gov and Kate.E.Timberlake@mass.gov. The text of the e-mail must specify: (1) the docket number of the proceeding (D.P.U. 23-OGAF-GRID); (2) the name of the person or company submitting the filing; and (3) a brief descriptive title of the document. All documents submitted in electronic format will be posted on the Department's website as soon as practicable at <http://www.mass.gov/dpu>. The e-mail must also include the name, title, and telephone number of a person to contact in the event of questions about the filing. To the extent a person or entity wishes to submit comments in accordance with this Notice, electronic submission, as detailed above, is sufficient.
