### NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 23-PGAF-GRID

August 17, 2023

Petition of Boston Gas Company d/b/a National Grid pursuant to G.L. c. 164 and 220 CMR 6.04, 6.11 for approval of its 2023/24 local distribution adjustment factor and peak gas adjustment factor filings, effective November 1, 2023.

On August 3, 2023, Boston Gas Company d/b/a National Grid (“Company” or “National Grid”) filed with the Department of Public Utilities (“Department”) its seasonal local distribution adjustment factor filing (“LDAF”), pursuant to G.L. c. 164 and 220 CMR 6.11. The filing includes the residential assistance adjustment factor (“RAAF”), remediation adjustment factor (“RAF”), attorney general consultant expense factor (“AGCEF”), energy efficiency surcharge (“EES”), and pension adjustment factor (“PAF”). The proposed rates are for effect November 1, 2023. The Department has docketed this petition as D.P.U. 23-PGAF-GRID.

The table below summarizes the proposed rates in dollars per therm:

If the Department approves the Company’s LDAFs as proposed, a typical Boston Gas residential heating customer will see an **average monthly bill decrease of \$0.50 or 0.2 percent**, and a typical former Colonial Gas residential heating customer will see an **average monthly bill increase of \$1.57 or 0.7 percent**, compared to the LDAF currently in effect. For specific bill impacts, please contact the Company as shown below.

The Company will file its peak gas adjustment factor filing (“GAF”) in this docket at least 45 days prior to the date on which the proposed GAFs are to be effective. The Company is required to file its peak GAF filing no later than September 18, 2023. National Grid may, at any time during the peak period, submit an amended GAF filing. The amended GAF filing must be submitted seven business days before the first billing cycle of the month in which it is proposed to take effect.

Any person interested in commenting on the LDAF filing may submit written comments no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on **Friday, September 15, 2023**. Any person interested in commenting on the GAF filing may submit written comments no later than the close of business on **Monday, October 2, 2023**.

The text of the e mail must specify: (1) the docket number of the proceeding (D.P.U. 23-PGAF-GRID); (2) the name of the person or company submitting the filing; and (3) a brief descriptive title of the document. The electronic file name should identify the document but should not exceed 50 characters in length. Importantly, all large files submitted must be broken down into electronic files that do not exceed 20 MB. All documents submitted in electronic format will be posted on the Department's website through our online File Room as soon as practicable (enter "23-PGAF-GRID") at: <https://eeaonline.eea.state.ma.us/DPU/Fileroom/dockets/bynumber>.

Please note that in the interest of transparency any comments will be posted to our website as received and without redacting personal information, such as addresses, telephone numbers, or email addresses. As such, consider the extent of information you wish to share when submitting comments. The Department strongly encourages public comments to be submitted by email. The filing and all subsequent related documents submitted to the Department or issued by the Department will be available on the Department's website as referenced above as soon as is practicable.
