NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 22-GREC-03

May 11, 2022

Petition of Boston Gas Company d/b/a National Grid, pursuant to G.L. c. 164, § 145, for Approval of the Reconciliation of its 2021 Gas System Enhancement Plan and Review and Approval of its Gas System Enhancement Reconciliation Adjustment Factors.

On April 29, 2022, Boston Gas Company (“Boston Gas Division”) d/b/a National Grid (“National Grid” or “Company”) submitted to the Department of Public Utilities (“Department”) a reconciliation of its 2021 gas system enhancement plan (“GSEP”) to replace aging natural gas pipeline infrastructure. The Company calculated that it will need to collect \$18,952,529 for the Boston Gas Division and \$922,228 for the former Colonial Gas Company (“Colonial Gas Division”) from ratepayers as under-recoveries through the gas system enhancement reconciliation adjustment factors (“GSERAFs”) for the period from November 1, 2022 to October 31, 2023. The Department has docketed this matter as D.P.U. 22-GREC-03.

National Grid proposes, for Boston Gas Company, the following GSERAFs by rate class sector for effect November 1, 2022:

National Grid proposes, for the Colonial Gas Division, the following GSERAFs by rate sector for effect November 1, 2022:

Residential (R-1 to R-4)	0.0039
Low Annual Use Commercial and Industrial (C&I) (G-41/G-51)	0.0034
Medium Annual Use C&I (G-42/G-52)	0.0030
High Annual Use C&I (G-43/G-53)	0.0015

National Grid states that approval of the GSERAFs for Boston Gas Company will result in an average monthly bill increase of \$2.19, or 1.0 percent, for the average residential heating customer using 115 therms per month during winter months, and an average monthly bill increase of \$0.50, or 1.0 percent, for the average residential heating customer using 27 therms per month during summer months. National Grid states that approval of the GSERAFs for the Colonial Gas Division will result in an average monthly bill increase of \$0.42, or 0.2 percent, for the average residential heating customer using 109 therms per month during winter months, and an average monthly bill increase of \$0.10, or 0.2 percent, for the average residential heating customer using 27 therms per month during summer months.

The Department is providing an extended written comment period and any person interested in commenting on this matter may submit written comments no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on Friday, June 17, 2022. The Department strongly encourages public comments to be submitted by email. If, however, a member of the public is unable to send written comments by email, a paper copy may be sent to Mark D. Marini, Secretary, Department of Public Utilities, One South Station, 5th Floor, Boston, Massachusetts, 02110.

Any person who desires to participate in the evidentiary phase of this proceeding must file a written petition for leave to intervene with the Department not later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on Tuesday, May 31, 2022. A petition for leave to intervene must satisfy the timing and substantive requirements of 220 CMR 1.03. All petitions for leave to intervene must be submitted by email only to dpu.efiling@mass.gov, katherine.e.stock@mass.gov, and the Company's attorney at melissa.liazos@nationalgrid.com. Receipt by the Department, not mailing, constitutes filing and determines whether a petition has been timely filed. A petition filed late may be disallowed as untimely, unless good cause is shown for waiver under 220 CMR 1.01(4). To be allowed, a petition under 220 CMR 1.03(1) must satisfy the standing requirements of G.L. c. 30A, § 10. All responses to petitions to intervene must be filed by email by the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on the second business day after the petition to intervene was

filed. The Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts filed a notice to intervene in this matter pursuant to G.L. c. 12, § 11E(a).

Documents provided to the Department must specify: (1) the docket number of the proceeding (D.P.U. 22-GREC-03); (2) the name of the person or company submitting the filing; (3) a brief descriptive title of the document; and (4) the name, title, email address, and telephone number of a person to contact in the event of questions about the filing.

The Companies' filing and all related documents submitted to the Department or issued by the Department will be available on the Department's website as soon as is practicable at <https://eeaonline.eea.state.ma.us/DPU/Fileroom/dockets/bynumber> (enter "22-GREC-03"). A paper copy of the filing will not be available for public viewing at the Companies' offices or the Department due to the State of Emergency.
