NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 17-164

December 15, 2017

Petition of Fitchburg Gas and Electric Light Company d/b/a Unitil, Massachusetts Electric Company and Nantucket Electric Company d/b/a National Grid, and NSTAR Electric Company and Western Massachusetts Electric Company d/b/a Eversource Energy for approval of a proposed revision of Section 3.4.1 of the Standards of Interconnection of Distributed Generation Tariff.

On October 20, 2017, Fitchburg Gas and Electric Light Company d/b/a Unitil, Massachusetts Electric Company and Nantucket Electric Company d/b/a National Grid, and NSTAR Electric Company and Western Massachusetts Electric Company d/b/a Eversource Energy (collectively, "Distribution Companies") filed a joint proposed revision of Section 3.4.1 of the Standards of Interconnection of Distributed Generation Tariff ("Interconnection Tariff"), known as Group Study. If approved, the proposed revision would replace the Group Study pilot, which took place from June 1, 2015 through May 31, 2016. The Department docketed this filing as D.P.U. 17-164.

The purpose of Group Study is to allow the Distribution Companies to simultaneously study multiple interconnection applications for proposed facilities in the same area on a company's electric power system that may require a common modification or may have a cumulative impact on a company's electric power system. In the petition, the Distribution Companies propose to continue with Group Study on a permanent basis, with modifications to the original pilot provisions including, but not limited to, modified and new definitions, changes to when a Group Study commences, and consensus requirements for instances including extensions of deadlines and project changes.

The Department seeks comments from interested stakeholders on the Group Study revisions as proposed by the Distribution Companies. In addition, the Department also seeks comment specific to the following items as they pertain to Group Study:

- Currently, Group Study is exempt from reporting in the Distribution Companies Timeline Enforcement Mechanism. <u>Order on a Timeline Enforcement Mechanism</u>, D.P.U. 11-75-F, at 9 n.12 (2014). Should Group Study be subject to an enforcement mechanism (<u>i.e.</u>, included in the Timeline Enforcement Mechanism or included as a separate enforcement mechanism)?
- 2. Does the current pre-application report process, as established in Section 3.2 of the Interconnection Tariff, provide adequate information for both interconnecting customers and Distribution Companies in assessing proposed interconnecting projects?
 - (a) If no, what additional information could prove useful at this stage for interconnecting customers?
 - (b) If no, is there additional information that should be included on the pre-application report that would assist in the assessment of proposed interconnection projects?
- 3. Does the level of detail currently provided in cost-estimates and final costs for distribution upgrades provide sufficient granularity and level of detail for interconnection customers?
- 4. How has the establishment of timeframes "by mutual agreement" worked in practice for the Group Study process to date?
- 5. How does the existing Interconnection Tariff serve to implement new or revised national standards for the interconnection process (e.g., IEEE 1547)?
