NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 17-29 February 17, 2017

Petition of Boston Gas Company and Colonial Gas Company, each d/b/a National Grid for approval of its Revenue Decoupling Adjustment Factors for the 2017 Off Peak Period, May 1, 2017, through October 31, 2017.

On January 31, 2017, Boston Gas Company and Colonial Gas Company, each d/b/a National Grid ("Company") filed a petition with the Department of Public Utilities ("Department") for approval of its revenue decoupling adjustment factors ("RDAFs"), for effect May 1, 2017. This filing was made pursuant to Boston Gas Company/Essex Gas Company/Colonial Gas Company, D.P.U. 10-55, at 52-54 (2010) and the Company's revenue decoupling adjustment clause ("RDAC") tariff, M.D.P.U. No. 5.3. The RDAC allows the Company to modify, on a semi-annual basis, its base distribution rates as a result of changes in customer usage, in order to promote the efficient deployment of demand resources. D.P.U. 10-55, at 52-54. The Department has docketed this petition as D.P.U. 17-29.

The Company proposes the following RDAFs for Boston Gas Company, effective May 1, 2017:

For Colonial Gas Company, the Company proposes the following RDAFs, effective May 1, 2017:

The Company proposes to recover approximately \$1.5 million in bill credits applied to customers in accordance with a Settlement Agreement reached between the Company and the Massachusetts Attorney General, currently under review in <u>Boston Gas Company/Colonial Gas Company</u>, D.P.U. 16-170.

As a result of the changes to the RDAF, the average Boston Gas residential heating customer using 29 therms per month during the off peak period will experience a bill increase of \$0.25 or 0.68 percent compared to the previously effective off-peak RDAFs. The average Colonial Gas residential heating customer using 27 therms per month during the off peak period will experience a bill increase of \$0.13 or 0.37 percent compared to the previously effective off-peak RDAFs. National Grid states that the average bill impact for all Boston Gas rate classes for customers on basic service during the off-peak period will range between an increase of 0.21 percent to 1.05 percent depending on the customer's rate class. National Grid adds that the average bill impact for all Colonial Gas rate classes for customers on basic service during the off-peak period will be less than one percent depending on the customer's rate class.
