NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 19-03

January 24, 2019

Petition of Massachusetts Electric Company and Nantucket Electric Company each d/b/a National Grid, for approval of their annual Pension/PBOP Adjustment Factors for effect March 1, 2019.

On January 15, 2019, Massachusetts Electric Company and Nantucket Electric Company, each d/b/a National Grid ("Company") filed a petition with the Department of Public Utilities ("Department") for approval of its annual pension and post-retirement benefits other than pensions ("PBOP") adjustment factors ("PAFs"). The Company made this filing pursuant to tariff M.D.P.U. 1353. The Company states that its proposed PAFs include a refund of excess accumulated deferred income tax associated with the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017. The Department docketed this petition as D.P.U. 19-03.

The Company proposes the following PAFs, effective March 1, 2019:

Residential (R-1/R-2)	\$0.00195
Residential – Time-of-Use (R-4)	\$0.00274
General Service – Small Commercial and Industrial (G-1)	\$0.00158

Time-of-Use (G-3)	\$0.00069
Streetlighting (S)	\$0.00649

The Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts ("Attorney General") filed a notice to intervene in this matter pursuant to G.L. c. 12, § 11E(a). Further, pursuant to G.L. c. 12, § 11E(b), the Attorney General filed a notice of intent to retain experts and consultants to assist her investigation of the Company's filing, and has requested Department approval to spend up to \$150,000 in this regard. Pursuant to G.L. c. 12, § 11E(b), the costs

incurred by the Attorney General relative to her retention of experts and consultants may be recovered in the Company's rates.

Any person who desires to file written comments on either the Company's filing or the Attorney General's notice of intent to retain experts and consultants or to participate otherwise in this proceeding shall file written comments or a petition for leave to intervene no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on **February 14, 2019**. One original of all written documents or petitions to intervene must be filed with Mark D. Marini, Secretary, Department of Public Utilities, One South Station, 5th Floor, Boston, Massachusetts 02110. In addition, one copy of all written comments should be sent to counsel for the Company, Meabh Purcell, Esq., National Grid, 40 Sylvan Road, Waltham, Massachusetts 02451.

A petition for leave to intervene must satisfy the timing and substantive requirements of 220 C.M.R. § 1.03. Receipt by the Department, not mailing, constitutes filing and determines whether a petition has been timely filed. A petition filed late may be disallowed as untimely, unless good cause is shown for waiver under 220 C.M.R. § 1.01(4). To be allowed, a petition under 220 C.M.R. § 1.03(1) must satisfy the standing requirements of G.L. c. 30A, § 10.

The text of the e-mail or CD-ROM label must specify: (1) the docket number of the proceeding (D.P.U. 19-03); (2) the name of the person or company submitting the filing; and (3) a brief descriptive title of the document.
