NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 20-26

March 12, 2020

Petition of Massachusetts Electric Company and Nantucket Electric Company, each doing business as National Grid, for Approval of their 2020 Energy Efficiency Reconciling Factors, for effect May 1, 2020.

On February 28, 2020, Massachusetts Electric Company and Nantucket Electric Company, each doing business as National Grid (“Companies”), filed with the Department of Public Utilities (“Department”) a petition seeking approval of their 2020 Energy Efficiency Reconciling Factors (“EERFs”), effective May 1, 2020. The Department docketed the Companies’ petition as D.P.U. 20-26.

An EERF collects additional funds for approved energy efficiency programs when the cost of implementing those programs exceeds other funding sources. See G.L. c. 25, § 19(a). The Companies propose EERFs of: (1) 1.848 cents per kilowatt-hour (“kWh”) for the residential rate class; (2) 0.236 cents per kWh for the low-income rate class; and (3) 0.717 cents per kWh for the commercial and industrial (“C&I”) rate class.

If the Department approves the 2020 EERFs as proposed, a Massachusetts Electric Company residential basic service customer (R-1) using 600 kWh of electricity per month will experience a monthly bill increase of \$1.76 or approximately 1.1 percent, and a comparable Nantucket Electric Company residential customer will experience a bill increase of \$1.76 or approximately 1.0 percent. A Massachusetts Electric Company residential low-income (R-2) basic service customer using 600 kWh of electricity per month will experience a monthly bill decrease of \$0.24, or approximately 0.2 percent, and a comparable Nantucket Electric Company residential low-income customer will experience a bill decrease of approximately \$0.23 or 0.2 percent. C&I customers will experience an increase to monthly bills in the range of 0.3 percent to 0.8 percent. For specific bill impacts, please contact the Companies as shown below.

All documents should also be submitted to the Department in electronic format using one of the following methods: (1) by e-mail attachment to dpu.efiling@state.ma.us and the Hearing Officer, Krista L. Hawley, at krista.hawley@mass.gov; or (2) on a CD-ROM or USB drive. The text of the e-mail, CD-ROM, or USB drive must specify: (1) the docket number of the proceeding (D.P.U. 20-26); (2) the name of the person or company submitting the filing; and (3) a brief descriptive title of the document. The electronic filing should also include the name, title, and telephone number of a person to contact in the event of questions about the filing. The electronic file name should identify the document, but should not exceed 50 characters in length.
