### NOTICE OF FILING AND REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

D.P.U. 20-GAF-P5

September 14, 2020

Petition of Boston Gas Company and Colonial Gas Company, each d/b/a National Grid pursuant to G.L. c. 164 and 220 CMR 6.04, 6.11 for approval of its 2020/21 peak local distribution adjustment factor and gas adjustment factor filings, effective November 1, 2020.

On July 31, 2020, Boston Gas Company, and Colonial Gas Company, each d/b/a National Grid (“National Grid” or “Companies”) filed with the Department of Public Utilities (“Department”) its seasonal local distribution adjustment factor filing (“LDAF”), pursuant to G.L. c. 164 and 220 CMR 6.11. The filing includes the residential assistance adjustment factor (“RAAF”), remediation adjustment factor (“RAF”), attorney general consultant expense factor (“AGCEF”), energy efficiency surcharge (“EES”), and pension adjustment factor (“PAF”). The proposed rates are for effect November 1, 2020. The Department has docketed this petition as D.P.U. 20-GAF-P5.

The tables below summarize the proposed LDAF rates in dollars per therm for customers:

If the Department approves the Companies’ LDAFs as proposed, a typical Boston Gas Company residential heating (R-3) customer will see an average monthly bill increase of \$5.93, or 3.0 percent, and a typical Colonial Gas Company residential heating (R-3) customer will see an average monthly bill increase of \$5.16, or 3.3 percent, compared to the LDAFs currently in effect. For specific bill impacts, please contact the Companies as shown below.

The Companies will file their peak gas adjustment factor filing (“GAF”) in this docket at least 45 days prior to the date on which the proposed GAFs are to be effective. The Companies are required to file their peak GAF filing no later than September 17, 2020. The Companies may, at any time during the peak period, submit an amended GAF filing. The amended GAF

filing must be submitted seven business days before the first billing cycle of the month in which it is proposed to take effect.

Any person interested in commenting on the **LDAF** filing may submit written comments no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on **Monday, September 28, 2020**. Any person interested in commenting on the **GAF** filing may submit written comments no later than the close of business on **Thursday, October 1, 2020**. At this time, all filings will be submitted only in electronic format in recognition of the difficulty that parties and the Department may have filing and receiving original copies. On March 10, 2020, Governor Baker issued a state of emergency related to COVID-19 for the entire Commonwealth. Ordinarily, all parties would follow Sections B.1 and B.4 of the Department's Standard Ground Rules (D.P.U. 15-184-A, App. 1 (March 4, 2020)); however, until further notice, parties must retain the original paper version, and the Department will later determine when the paper version must be filed with the Department Secretary. Importantly, all large files submitted must be broken down into electronic files that do not exceed 20MB. All documents should be submitted to the Department in **PDF format** by e-mail attachment to [peter.ray@mass.gov](mailto:peter.ray@mass.gov) and [katherine.goyette@mass.gov](mailto:katherine.goyette@mass.gov). The text of the e-mail must specify: (1) the docket number of the proceeding (D.P.U. 20-GAF-P5); (2) the name of the person or company submitting the filing; and (3) a brief descriptive title of the document. All documents submitted in electronic format will be posted on the Department's website as soon as practicable at <http://www.mass.gov/dpu>. The e-mail must also include the name, title, and telephone number of a person to contact in the event of questions about the filing. To the extent a person or entity wishes to submit comments in accordance with this Notice, electronic submission, as detailed above, is sufficient. A paper copy of the filing will not be available for public viewing at the Companies' offices or the Department's office due to the state of emergency.
