Investigation by the Department of Public Utilities into Massachusetts Electric Company d/b/a National Grid 2022 Service Quality Report filed pursuant to Service Quality Standards for Electric Distribution Companies and Local Gas Distribution Companies, D.P.U. 12-120-D (2015).

On March 1, 2023, Massachusetts Electric Company d/b/a National Grid (“Company”) filed with the Department of Public Utilities (“Department”) the Company’s 2022 service quality report (“2021 SQ Report”) for the period January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022. The Company’s 2021 SQ Report compares its performance during 2022 with the Department’s service quality guidelines set forth in Service Quality Standards for Electric Distribution Companies and Local Gas Distribution Companies, D.P.U. 12-120-D (2015) (“SQ Guidelines”), and the Company’s service quality plan that the Department approved in Massachusetts Electric Company and Nantucket Electric Company, D.P.U. 16-88 (2017). Per the SQ Guidelines, electric distribution companies may be subject to penalties for failure to meet the Department’s SQ performance standards for: System Average Interruptions Duration Index (“SAIDI”); System Average Interruptions Frequency Index (“SAIFI”); Circuit Average Interruptions Duration Index (“CKAIDI”); Circuit Average Interruptions Frequency Index (“CKAIFI”); Customer Complaints; and Customer Credit Cases. The Department has docketed this matter as D.P.U. 23-SQ-11.

The Department will accept written comments on the Company’s 2022 SQ Report. Any person interested in commenting on this matter may submit written comments no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on **June 1, 2023**. At this time, all filings will be submitted only in electronic format in recognition of the difficulty that parties and the Department may have filing and receiving original copies. Ordinarily, all parties would follow Sections B.1 and B.4 of the Department’s Standard Ground Rules (D.P.U. 15-184-A, App. 1 (March 4, 2020)); however, until further notice, parties must retain the original paper version and the Department will later determine when the paper version must be filed with the Department Secretary. Importantly, all large files submitted must be broken down into electronic files that do not exceed 20 MB.

All documents must be submitted to the Department in electronic format by e-mail attachment to dpu.efiling@mass.gov and Lauren.Morris@mass.gov. The text of the e-mail

must specify: (1) the docket number of the proceeding (D.P.U. 23-SQ-11); (2) the name of the person or company submitting the filing; and (3) a brief descriptive title of the document. All documents submitted in electronic format will be posted on the Department's website as soon as practicable at <http://www.mass.gov/dpu>. To the extent a person or entity wishes to submit comments in accordance with this Notice, electronic submission, as detailed above, is sufficient.
