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Easy energy saving tips

Set thermostats to 78° in summer, 68° in winter.

How the program works

Once you qualify, your local Community Action Program (CAP) agency will call to arrange a time when an Energy Specialist can visit your home to complete a no-cost energy assessment.

The Energy Specialist will look inside and out, from attic to basement, to find places where you can save energy and money.

You may also qualify for no-cost energy saving improvements, such as:



A no-cost replacement of your heating system



A no-cost replacement refrigerator, freezer, clothes washer, dehumidifier, and/or window A/C unit if your current appliance is inefficient



No-cost home and basement insulation, weather-stripping, and air sealing



No-cost installation of energyefficient lighting, advanced power strips, low-flow showerheads, and faucet aerators
